1	If Liam is anxious he may attempt to hit staff members. This is a risk for all staff, however is a significant risk to the driver. Driving staff could lose control of steering wheel, which can lead to accident.	2	3	6	Treat	1. Whenever possible Liam should be transport in people carrier in the middle row away from driver. 2. When staff transporting Liam in a car, he should be seated in the middle row, behind the driver. Second staff member should sit next to him and continue to engage Liam in his timetable. 3. If Liam begins to display signs of anxiety while driving, the driver should pull over as soon as it is safe to do so and wait for Liam to be calm. 4. Staff to keep in contact with Liam's mum if he is distressed in the car. 5. Staff to keep in touch with Primecare office on any issues, concerns that arise.	3	All staff	09/03/21
2	Liam may attempt to pull the steering wheel or handbrake of the car, this could potential result in an accident.	2	3	6	Treat	1. When transporting Liam in a car, he should be seated in the middle row of the people carrier (preferably behind the passenger) to prevent Liam being able to reach the steering wheel. 2. Staff should remain alert to Liam's changing mood, look for the triggers and stop the car if Liam displaying anxiety. 3. Staff to be mindful not to park on a slope 4. Seek additional support from Primecare office when necessary 5. Staff to stop the car if Liam is trying to gain acces to the handbreak 6. Driver must remove keys from ignition once stopped 7. Staff should not return to driving activity until Liam is presenting as calm.	2	All staff	09/03/21
3	If Liam is anxious he may attempt to get out of the car. This could result in injury or death.	2	3	6	Treat	1. Staff should ensure that the childlock remains on at all times when Liam is being transported in the car. The windows should also be locked to prevent him from opening the window and reaching the door handle from the outside. 2. Liam should also be sat in the middle row of the car as these are the doors childlock will be active on.	2	All staff	09/03/21
