1	Ben is known to abscond during times of significant stress or upset. Depending on the level of his stress Ben may take himself away from a situation and sit in a quieter spot This does not put Ben in danger and may give him time to process what is upsetting him	1	2	2	Treat	1. Staff should allow Ben to have time and space to 'chill out' try to encourage Ben to sit down in a safe place such as on a wall or on the kerb beside staff. If Ben wants to continue walking staff should not try and stop him But should follow slowly 2. Staff should encourage Ben to come and speak about what is upsetting him 3. If Ben Agrees staff should approach Ben with caution as he may still be upset 4. Ben will either come and sit with staff or ignore them and continue walking 5. If Ben becomes increasingly upset or stressed it may lead to him absconding (see below)	1	All staff	12/02/21
2	When Ben is extremely stressed or upset he may abscond from his home or from the care of his staff. Ben is not dangerous to strangers however he will have little road sense when frightened which could lead to him being hit by a car, resulting in injury or death	1	3	3	Treat	1. The staff member should try to follow Ben from a safe distance ensuring they are out of his eye sight (if possible). 2. The staff member should inform on call management (01506 890970) at the earliest opportunity whilst keeping an eye on Ben from a safe distance 3. If Ben stops staff should cautiously attempt to approach Ben to speak to him about how he is feeling 4. If Ben becomes aggressive towards the staff member, he/she should retreat. If staff feel Ben is a particular danger to members of the community Police should be called	2	All staff	12/02/21
