1	Dylan is known to abscond when he is anxious. Depending on the level of his anxiety Dylan may leave the flat and sit outside, this would indicate he needs some space and should be allowed this. One member of staff should discreetly watch Dylan to ensure he is still outside the flat/in the garden. Staff should allow Dylan some time to 'chill out' before trying to engage with him.	3	1	3	Treat	1. Staff should allow Dylan to have time and space to 'chill out' try to encourage Dylan to use his bedroom or his living room to chill out, but if Dylan wants to go outside staff should not try to stop him. 2. Staff should say to dylan "ok I will leave you for 5 minutes then I will come out". 3. After five minutes staff should approach Dylan and ask if he wants to chat. 4. Dylan will either come back inside at this point or he will abscond, in case of absconding follow protocol below.	2	All staff	13/10/20
2	When Dylan is highly anxious he will abscond from his flat or from the community. When he is anxious Dylan has little road sense and is very vulnerable.	3	3	9	Treat	1. One member of staff should try to follow Dylan from a safe distance ensuring they are out of his eye sight (if possible) the second member of staff should remain where they are and if Dylan does not return after 15 minutes then they should call the police. 2. Police should be informed that Dylan is a vulnerable adult who has Autism and a learning disability and he has absconded. Staff should give his name and DOB (Dylan Reid 07/04/01 - approx 5'8") and give a brief description of his appearance and what he is wearing at the time. 3. Police Scotland have a list of the most likely places that Dylan is likely to turn up and this will be updated regularly. 4. Staff should report to on call manager and keep them informed of situation.	6	All staff	13/10/20
